We are inviting you to participate in three different ways:

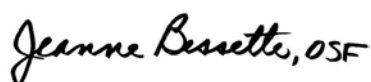
1. PRAYER We will pray together using the prayer written by Karen Berry; the prayer is included in this email, and we will place it on our social media.

*You can bring a food donation to JFC on November 21st.

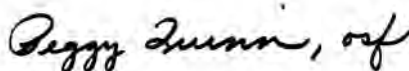
