Criteria upon which your application will be evaluated are:

- Clarity of goals with measurable objectives
- Assistance given to the economically poor or oppressed, or to an earth project in some form of direct action, or a project that helps bring about systemic change
- Other means of funding have been explored
- Evidence of fiscal responsibility of the applicant (Projected Budget)
- If funds were granted last year, a final report must be submitted.
